Working closely with Li-FT's Exploration and Community Engagement teams, the Environment and Permitting Manager is responsible for planning and executing environmental programs (e.g., baseline data collection, environmental compliance) and permitting activities (obtaining operating licences and permits, Environmental Assessment) with the support of technical consultants and Li-FT's CSO.
